2. Exhibitors and/or owners of all animals, including pets, are advised to ensure they have their own public liability insurance, in line with ISA Guidelines.
3. Belgooly Show Society takes no responsibility for any accident or loss.
4. Competitors must have regard to safety of animals and other competitors and the public in any gathering area, practice arena or pocket area. Failure to have regard to safety, or disobeying the instructions of Show Officials or Stewards may cause a competitor to be eliminated before their competition begins. Entry fee is forfeited.
5. The owner or occupier of land or premises shall not cause or permit a dog whose ears have been cropped to be present at an event where dogs are shown, compete or are used in connection with a sporting or cultural activity. Please note if you own a dog that has their ears cropped, you could be asked to leave an event where there is a Dog Show.
6. Any handler whose animal is not in his/her control shall be asked to remove said animal from the Arena and/or Showfield by a Judge, Steward, or Belgooly Show Official.
7. Any exhibitor entering an animal in any event in the Show does so on the understanding that the animal has not been in contact with any infectious or notifiable disease within two months of the Show.
8. Entries will not be accepted once catalogue is gone to print.
9. The Society shall not be responsible for any errors or omissions in the entry forms or in the catalogue.
10. With regard to GDPR, the data given freely to Belgooly Show Society by Exhibitors, Trade Stand Holders and Sponsors is held securely by the Show and is not distributed to, nor accessed by, any third party.
11. The decision of all judges is final.
12. Owners of all animal exhibits are advised that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the Judges, Stewards or Show Officials on the part of the owner, attendant, handler or rider, will disqualify the animal from adjudication, or from taking a prize, and the owner shall forfeit his/her entry fee.
13. Each exhibitor is responsible for furnishing correct information regarding animals entered in the show.
14. A person failing to exhibit an entry shall forfeit his/her entry fee.
15. The Society reserves the right to alter, amalgamate, or cancel any class or competition at any time.
16. The Society reserves the right to replace or substitute any prize-money by a cup, trophy, voucher, or nomination, or vice-versa.
17. Any objection to any prize-winner in any class or competition must be lodged in writing with the Belgooly Show Secretary within ONE HOUR of the judging of the event, together with a fee of €100, which will be forfeited in the event of the objection being over-ruled.
18. In all classes restricted in height, animals may be measured by a Veterinary Surgeon.

19. SHARP SPURS MUST NOT BE WORN.
Judges may disqualify any competitor who is, in their opinion, using unnecessary severity on a horse.
The judges of jumping competitions may eliminate any horse which is acting in a dangerous manner or highly destructive manner; any such horse may be eliminated at any stage of its rounds.
20. All Prize-winning animals may be examined by a Veterinary Surgeon.
21. The Society requires signature for receipt and return of perpetual cups. The person to whom the cup is awarded gives an undertaking that the cup will be returned to Belgooly Show in good condition. No Perpetual trophy can be won out-right.
22. Perpetual Trophies remain the property of Belgooly Show.
23. Prizes will be paid in accordance with the rules of the Irish Shows Association.

DISCIPLINE

The Irish Shows Association expects and will insist upon appropriate behaviour from all Exhibitors and others participating in any of the activities at our Member Shows and will not tolerate inappropriate behaviour.

Inappropriate behaviour shall include but not be limited to the following:

- Profanity, coarse or vulgar language or gestures towards judges or other Show officials.
- Harassment or bullying, including using words or actions that threaten, intimidate or undermine judges or other officials before, during or following Member Show activities.
- Failure to follow rules and/or obey instructions.
- Abusing any animal.

Disciplinary Procedures:

Complaints of misconduct against an Exhibitor or other participant at a Member Show shall be investigated and adjudicated upon by a subcommittee appointed by the Irish Shows Association. The said subcommittee shall consist of three members of the board of the Irish Shows Association and shall be known as the Disciplinary Committee. The Disciplinary Committee shall seek to ensure the existence of consistent, effective, fair and transparent complaint procedures and shall act in accordance with the natural and constitutional justice.

Important Notice to Animal Owners involved in showing animals at Shows.

The Irish Shows Association would advise all animal owners who have their animals Insured to have the Insurance cover extended to cover them while showing animals at Shows, it may cost very little or nothing at all depending on who you have Insurance with.

The reason for giving this advice is that if your animal were to injure someone or damage someone's property, and it is established that your animal was out of your control at that time, you may be held responsible, or partly responsible for any injury or damage caused, and could end up paying all, or part of any Court Award or settlement reached.

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, FOOD AND THE MARINE NOTICE
SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS – HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES

Premises Registration

As from 1st May 2012, any premises (**which includes shows, fairs and markets**) where horses or other equines are gathered must be registered with the Department. Owners/persons in charge of such gatherings are required to submit a completed application form for registration and to keep records of movements on/off their premises.

Records must be retained for at least 3 years as they may be required by the Department for the purposes of tracing disease.

Records required are:

- The name and address of the owner/person in charge of the premises from which the equine came.
- Premises Registration Number from which the equine came.
- Passport Number/UEL Number of the animal.

It is important therefore that Show organisers should contact their local District Veterinary Office in advance so that consideration can be given to compliance with the requirements outlined above.

Rules for Small Hunter Championship 2026

1. Qualifying rounds will be held at designated shows.
2. The qualifying horse may be a MARE or GELDING, 4 years old and over. The horse must be over 148cms but not exceeding 158cms.
3. The Small Hunter should be a blood horse. He/She should be short of leg, with a good deep body and should have a lot of character and presence with an exemplary temperament.
4. First and Second placed small hunters in designated shows may qualify for the final. In the event of 1st and 2nd being qualified, 3rd and 4th may go forward to the final.
5. **Judge of the day must sign the qualifying entry form(s)**
6. On completion of judging at qualifiers the successful qualifier will be given all relevant entry documentation by the ring steward. This must be completed and returned, along with the appropriate fee, to the secretary of Killusty Show within 14 days - this rule will be strictly adhered to. Online entry will be available on itsplainsailing.com when entries open.
7. The rider must be **16 years and over** on 01/01/2026.
8. Tack and Turn Out Recommended for Ridden Hunter Classes: Mane should be plaited, tail pulled. Heels trimmed. Plain tack, brown is preferred. Black tack is very rarely seen in affiliated Hunter classes. Double or pelham for open classes, snaffles for novices. If a rugby pelham is used, then a sliphead improves the look a lot. Plain browband and noseband. A straight cut or working hunter saddle will show off the horse's shoulders and movement. Leather girth, or a white one is acceptable if your horse is grey, as a dark girth can distract the eye. Quartermarkers are correct (optional) for hunters and hunter ponies
9. Rider Attire: Beige or canary jodhpurs or breeches, long boots. Shirt and tie. Tweed jacket. Spurs may be worn, but dummy spurs are acceptable
10. Horses will be judged on type, conformation, way of going, ridden performance and action in-hand.
11. Random Dope testing may be carried out on the day of the final.

12. Horse passports must be present on the day of the final.
13. Any objection must be lodged in writing with the show secretary within half an hour following the completion of the competition, together with €50 which is refundable if the objection is upheld.
14. Killusty Show Committee, in consultation with the sponsor, reserves the right to amend the rules as may be deemed necessary.

Phase 1: Horses will complete a simple course of fences not exceeding 1.06 m height. Judging will be based on regularity of pace, obedience, presentation and fluency on overall performance. Jumping 16 points, overall performance 24 points.

Phase 2: Ride. 35 points.

Phase 3: Conformation and action in hand. 25 points.

Total 100 points.

Over reaching boots are permitted but no bandaging is allowed. Running martingales may not be worn. However, long standing martingales are permitted.

Rules for All Ireland Pony Champion Supreme 2026

Prize Fund: €1,000

1. Qualifying rounds will be held at designated shows.
2. **The Champion Supreme Pony** from designated shows may qualify for the final. In the event of the Champion already being qualified, the Reserve receives the qualifier. If both the Champion and the Reserve are already qualified then the qualifier will be reallocated to another show later in the showing calendar.

3. The Pony Supreme qualifying classes include; **In-hand Pony Champion (Welsh/ Broodmare), Youngstock Pony Champion, Connemara In-hand Champion, Connemara Ridden Champion, Connemara Working Hunter Champion, Show Pony Champion, Show Hunter Pony Champion, Open & Novice Working Hunter Pony Champion, Starter Stakes Champion, Intermediate Pony Champion, M & M Champion, Mini Champion.**
4. As the Intermediate Pony is included in the qualifiers; all pony entries must not exceed 158cms.
5. In the interest of fairness to all exhibitors, where qualifying shows hold separate Mini Supreme & Supreme Championship, there must be an overall Supreme chosen from these two champions. To decide the overall champion, they must compete against one another and be judged accordingly. It should be considered as a separate class and must comprise of a show piece. Please brief judges on the qualifying rules in advance of judging the Supreme
6. Under IPS Rules, ponies must be measured before competing in ANY Ridden Class. The pony owner or the person responsible for presenting the pony at the Measuring Session is responsible for making themselves familiar with the Rules of Measuring ponies and those of Appeal. Ponies owned, wholly or partially, by Irish residents of the thirty-two (32) counties (irrespective of where such ponies are located or maintained) must compete under IPS or SJI Measurement Schemes to comply with the Rules therein. The Council, through its relevant committee, has the authority to ask for any pony to be re-measured.
7. Finalists (pony and rider combination) must compete in a **minimum of one class** at Killusty Show on the 4/7/26.
8. On arrival in the final on the day of the show, the finalists will receive €50 for participating in the final. In the event of a finalist not presenting at the final, their €50 will be added to the Champion's prize money. The **Champion of the All Ireland Pony Champion Supreme final receives €500.**
9. Riders must be have attained their 4th Birthday by the 1/1/2026.
10. On completion of judging at qualifiers the successful qualifier will be given all relevant entry documentation by the ring steward. This must be completed and returned, along with the appropriate fee, to the secretary of Killusty Show within 14 days - this rule will be strictly adhered to.
11. Ponies will be judged on type, conformation, way of going and action in-hand.
12. Random Dope testing may be carried out on the day of the final.
13. Any objection must be lodged in writing with the show secretary within half an hour following the completion of the competition, together with €50 which is refundable if the objection is upheld.
14. This Championship is open to IPS members and Non – IPS members.
15. Finalist may be asked perform a set show for the final.
16. In the event that a qualified finalist cannot attend the final, we ask that you inform the secretary out of courtesy as soon as possible. A 'wild card' may be provided to a show that did not receive a qualifier in the draw for the shows to ensure that the final has maximum participants.
